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I would like to share with you the foundation of every believer, God's Word – the Bible! God's Word is the foundation of our faith and our life. Without it we cannot understand God, hear Him, or believe in Him! God's Word is guide for our Christian life.

Unfortunately some regard it lightly. Others perhaps read it as if it were an interesting book, yet they do not accept it; perhaps they do not read it at all, or if they do they read only the parts in pertaining their present situation. However, there are believers who believe every word and principle and as a result lead blessed, righteous, and eternal lives.

One unknown author once said: "People reject the Bible not because it contradicts itself rather because it contradicts them. The Bible's purpose is not only information but transformation." Many people today in the world as well as in the church see the Bible as an interesting and informative book. This is one of the main reasons why believers live unchanged and disorderly lives,

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because they do not allow God's Word to change sinful attitudes and faulty life principles that destroy their lives.

▶ 1. STATISTICS AND HISTORIC EVENTS REGARDING GOD'S WORD

George Barna (of *Barna Research Institute*) in his research regarding the Bible provides interesting information. As far as the **belief in the accuracy of the Bible**, his statistics show us that 13% of those questioned, who are born-again Christians, do not believe that the "Bible is totally accurate in its entirety". (Research from 2001)

While the majority believes that the Bible is accurate in its entirety, some believers do not believe that all of it is important or relevant to us today. 18% of Christians (every fifth person) does not believe that "The 10 Commandments are relevant or important to our life today". (Research from 1992)

As far as **knowledge** about the Bible, 38% of Christians (born-again) believe that the entire Bible was written many years after Jesus' death and resurrection. 62% know that Isaiah is a book in the Old Testament. One out of every 10 (11%) believe that Isaiah's book is found in the New Testament, and 27% admitted that they did not know where it could be found. 49% believe that

the Bible teaches that money is the root of all evil, while a third of them (37%) do not agree with this as the verse teaches that the love of money is the root of all evil.

As far as **reading** the Bible, according to statistics, women read the Bible more than men (women 46% - men 37%). Approximately 42% of them said that reading the Bible was a very important thing in their life. The average time for reading the Bible through the week is 52 minutes.

These statistics could be much better. One thing is certain, if we do not read God's Word, if are not personally studying it, if we do not know it then we are weak Christians open to Satan's attack and are a stumbling block to those who believe in God's Word and desire to grow in His Kingdom. Deaf, blind, empty, lost, and rebellions – this is the picture of those who do not keep God's Word.

Today's generation of believers is more sensual than faithful. We always want something going on around us, fun and fellowship; we believe everything we hear, but we will not believe the Word! A.W. Tozer once said [paraphrase]: "Today's church is idolatrous and worships the great god – fun!" Many believers stop going to church because they want to have fun. In previous times it was enough to simply preach about Jesus, but today it is necessary to excite people in order to get them to come to church.

Once, in one Canadian church, around a thousand people came to a Sunday meeting to hear the most well-known evangelist of that time, J.W. Morgan. When he was not able to

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come on time, as he missed his train, the pastor informed the congregation that Morgan would not be coming. As soon as he shared the news all those who came to hear Morgan began to rise from their pews to leave the church. When the pastor saw what was taking place he said to them: "All those we came to hear J.W. Morgan please leave as soon as possible, all those who came to hear Jesus please be seated."

Today many wish to follow charisma or individuality, we want to see signs and wonders; we want to follow Peter and Paul, to hear someone prophesy, fall under the power, make animal noises, or see gold dust fall from heaven, but no one wants to hear the truth of God's Word!

The church today has transferred its focus from God's Word to people! Believers no longer respect and value God's Word! They are prejudiced against pastors and will not receive those who preach God's Word; automatically rejecting it, some actually make fun of it.

Personally I am not against the gifts of the Spirit and His moving in our churches; I really wish that there were more of the Holy Spirit's moving in churches, but His help is not found in worship, prayer, prophesy, or the gifts of the Spirit rather it is primarily found in God's Word! When Jesus spoke God's Word in power people were set free, saved, and healed.

Martin Luther once said, regarding the interpretation of God's Word [paraphrase]: "I realized that the appearance of all heresy and sin does not result from simple declaration of the

Bible, rather from neglecting the Bible and when people follow argument of their own mind."

We quickly criticize the Word but are slow to obey it! Today when believers hear the Word many are quick to say, "Yes but..." instead of "*Speak, Your servant is listening*". For example, in **1 Chronicles 17:23** we find David's wonderful prayer praising God's Word declaring that God would be praised and His home blessed: "*And now, O LORD, the word which You have spoken concerning Your servant and concerning his house, let it be established forever, and do as You have said. So let it be established, that Your name may be magnified forever, saying, 'The LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, is Israel's God.' And let the house of Your servant David be established before You. For You, O my God, have revealed to Your servant that You will build him a house. Therefore Your servant has found it in his heart to pray before You.*"

God's Word is the foundation of our obedience! We can't say that we are obedient if we are not totally obedient to His Word! We will look a little further at more biblical examples, but we can say with surety that David listened and fulfilled God's Word!

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John Wesley once said: “Try all things by the written word, and let all bow down before it. You are in danger of fanaticism every hour, if you depart every so little from Scripture; yea, or from the plain, literal meaning of an text, taken in connection with the context.”

Today the church of the Lord Jesus is filled with these fanatics. Many twist the Word to their own advantage. Some even claim that the Old Testament is no longer relevant, rather only the New Testament is relevant to us today. The truth is that the ceremonial sacrificial rituals changed, but His moral and eternal principles, which are revealed in the whole of God’s Word, have not changed.

In the year 1910 a prophesy was given at the “Azusa Street Revival” through one of the respected workers who said that the Pentecostal movement would spread by the end of twentieth century, but there would be three foundational sins set by the enemy for this movement and believers who are filled with the Holy Spirit.

a. It will emphasize personal power instead of righteousness

There is nothing wrong concerning God’s power, but it certainly must be rooted in God’s

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righteousness. Many preachers emphasize power and the gifts of the Spirit because they have not been rooted in God’s righteousness; they end up in immorality, financial disgrace or the trap of their own pride.

It is possible to have gifts without character, but God’s Word brings about character necessary for our life, it bears fruit, the fruit of obedience! Believers today want signs and wonders and instant solutions, but they don’t want His righteousness, they don’t want to be obedient to His Word. The Word tells us to *“Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added to you.”*

Many revivals emphasize the Holy Spirit and many expect only the supernatural, yet the supernatural is when God’s people obey that which is already revealed in God’s Word. If you actually look at little closer at the Word you will never find as many problems concerning the supernatural as you will find with disobedience to God’s Word!

b. Churches will over emphasize worship because it is easier to worship and sing than to pray

It is harder to agonize for souls than to worship! Personally I love to worship and singing, however we can worship and sing an hour or two each day, but we can’t spend even a second in prayer for the unsaved!

Worship can never replace public prayer, but unfortunately our generation loves concerts,

films, fellowship, Christian football, Christian barbeques, multimedia projects, social activities, and going to seminars more than prayer and obeying God's Word! We can sing to Jesus Christ for hours on end but not have a drop of love for the unsaved around us or to befriend a visitor in the church. The church today has become a mere subculture and it is out of touch with the world around her.

c. It will emphasize the Holy Spirit above Jesus

Jesus Christ in **John 15:26** said: *"But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me."*

The verse does not say that when the Holy Spirit comes we will prophesy cast out evil spirits, laugh, cry, and feel good, rather it says we will testify about Jesus. The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to glorify and magnify Jesus, not man! He will not give glory to another!

"Spirit", in the Greek, is *parakaletos* – He is the one who stands by us and points us to Calvary and says: "Look to Calvary, look to the cross, look to Jesus, look the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world; I want to tell you something about Him..." The Holy Spirit does not say: "Look to me, I want to reveal myself or glorify special people with special gifts!"

Experiences are not the foundation of our faith; we may pray, testify, or serve and at times feel nothing – but that does not mean

that God has changed; it does not mean that God's Word is no longer powerful! If I had lived by my feelings rather than by faith in God's Word I would have fallen many times by now and been removed from ministry, but I stood stable by the grace of God because my faith is not founded on feelings but rather on the entire Word of God!

► **2. VERSES ABOUT GOD'S WORD**

King David in **Psalms 138:2** says, *"I will worship toward Your holy temple, And praise Your name For Your lovingkindness and Your truth; For You have magnified Your word above all Your name."*

In the Hebrew language "word" is *emrah* and comes from the word *emer* meaning to speak or say. This example is always used in the Psalms when speaking about God's Word.

We don't need to believe all that we hear; rather we need to believe God's Word because according to David God exalts His Word above all! Above all human opinions God's Word stands!

This is why it is better to use God's Word when we testify because we know that the Word says that it will not return void. We ought not to dance around the truth merely inviting the unsaved to church or philosophize the Bible; rather we should simply speak the Word! We don't have to water down the message for fear that people will not understand. God exalts His Word above people's goodness and sacrifices, above all philosophy, vanity and futile thinking; the Word will always bring about results.

2 Timothy 2:15 – The Apostle Paul tells us: *“Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.”* In a Croatian translation we read: *“Don't be lazy, be tried and true before God – because you will 'rightly navigate the Word of Truth'”*

The Greek word for “navigate” or “divide” is *orthotomeo* which means correct, accurate separation, or just division. We all have verses that we hold to. A.W. Tozer once said [paraphrase], “Go back to the Bible and fulfill that which you have not underlined in it and then you will be a true Christian.”

Unfortunately, many believers treat the Word as if they were in a buffet restaurant. They don't want to be healthy, wanting to eat junk food; they want to be malnourished because they don't want the whole truth; they don't want to be balanced wanting only miracles and love; they don't want to hear about obedience. This is why there are so many unhealthy Christians.

Mark Twain, although he was not a Christian, once said: “It ain't those parts of the Bible that I can't understand that bother me, it is the parts that I do understand.”

This is why we need to rightly preach the Word of truth. If you want to dodge criticism then don't say anything, be nobody, be nothing, don't do anything. But truth is truth regardless of the consequences it brings. If we want God to use us as a vessel then we cannot be lazy and passive (we often call passivity “spirituality”), we need to know well the Word of God and preach it without fear. Only the truth of God's Word sets free! Jesus Christ said, *“You will know the truth and the truth will set you free!”*

2 Timothy 3:16-17: *“All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.”* Paul didn't distinguish between the Old or New Testaments, rather he said, *“All scripture...!”* God tells us that all Scripture is inspired and profitable.

The Greek word for “profitable” is *theopneutos*. *Theos* means God and *pneo* means to breathe. In other words – literally we can translate this “God breathed”. It is His life to all who receive it! We conform ourselves according to the Word, we nurture ourselves in righteousness, becoming perfected and thoroughly completed for the work of love. If we do not know the Word, if we do not listen but reject it – we will try to “be good but disobedient people”. We will speak to others about how obedient we are in everything except that with which we do not agree, but if we are obedient then we must be obedient in all things. We can’t choose those parts of God’s Word that we will and will not obey!

Mark 16:20 *“And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs.”*

Miracles accompany the Word, and not the other way around! The disciples did not hold seminars, preach, and give lessons in doing signs and wonders, rather they preached God’s Word and God confirmed His Word with signs and wonders. If we say that we do not have time for His Word then we say that we do not have time to be that which God wants us to be; we don’t have time for Him to work through us! We are doing God’s work our own way. We are doing what we want, but not what God wants of us!

Hebrews 4:12-13 *“For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. And there*

is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account.”

Before we preach to others we need to allow the Word of God to eliminate any part of our lives that is not pleasing to Him and then it will be powerful in us. God’s Word does not “divide” evil spirits, rather us personally

Acts 17:11 *“These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures [Old Testament] daily to find out whether these things were so.”*

In other words, noble believers are those who absorb that which they have heard. You hear many things wherever you go, and of course, there is nothing new under the sun. Someone may arise who has something new from the Bible and say, “We must go to this church or to that seminar because something is happening there that I have never seen before.”

Jesus Christ said that it is a rotten generation that seeks after signs and wonders, and unfortunately this is our modern generation that goes from church to church, from seminar to seminar to look for signs because they don’t want to hear God’s Word! They don’t want to eat healthy and tell the

unsaved about Jesus. The majority of them are selfish and sensual! Noble believers are those who receive the Word of God readily in the place where they are and examine that which they have heard!

The Word of God was so important to the early church that the apostles could not leave it to help serve the widows in Jerusalem, rather they placed deacons for that kind of service and said, *"Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, 'It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables.*

Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith." (Acts 6:2,7)

Humanitarian aid will not help spread the Word – this is the reason why many churches lost believers after the war in Croatia. Many came to church as long as there were packages and food. Similar to those 5,000 who came to hear the Word only as long as there was "food and drink", but left Jesus when the Word became tough!

In the beginning of John's gospel we read, *"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God – and the Word was God!"* Jesus Christ was the living Word which settled among us. God exalted His Word above all else. That's why He came to give God's Word to people; but unfortunately the people did not receive His

Word, rather they rejected it, killed Him, and continued in their own empty religion.

► 3. WE MUST RECEIVE GOD'S WORD WITHOUT PROTEST

There are so many verses and stories in relation to God's Word, but I would like to concentrate on and finish with two important things:

a. When God no longer wishes to reveal Himself and His intentions through His Word it is a sign of His judgment on us.

In **Amos 8:11-12** we read: *"Behold the days are coming," says the Lord, "that I will send a famine on the land, not a famine of bread, not a famine of thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord. They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; but they shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the Lord, but shall not find it."*

The purpose of Amos' book was to proclaim God's judgment on Israel, the northern kingdom; in respect to their grumbling, idolatry, and their oppression of the poor. Although, they were separated from their southern brothers, northern Israel was still regarded as God's people. But, unfortunately, they lived religiously; they revered idols and oppressed the poor. Suddenly Amos, an ordinary shepherd, proclaimed God's message before them. He was not a son of a prophet, rather an ordinary shepherd and stock breeder. He affronted them and called attention to the coming judgment.

If we harden our hearts to God's Word we will experience God's judgment, and after some time we will hunger and thirst for the hearing of God's Word but will not be able to find satisfaction.

That's how many pastors and churches are. They think that they hear from God while living in disobedience to the one through whom God is clearly speaking to them the revelation of His written Word, they carry on working and serving in their own power against God's revealed Word.

It's not strange why their sheep are poor, fleshly, and hungry – because they are found in darkness and under God's judgment. These go here and there to find at least a little food from the truth of God's Word, but the aspect of judgment is that they will not be able to clearly hear!

There is nothing as terrible as being called God's children and yet not being able to clearly hear your own Father speak. There is nothing so terrible as when He no longer guides us and speaks to us – this was always his judgment on Israel!

For more than one hundred years God did not manifest himself because they would not listen to His Words. Around four hundred years before Jesus' birth Israel was in darkness because she did not want to listen to God's Word. Imagine how long four hundred years in darkness would be!

When Amos spoke to them (99% of the time God speaks through people) and warned them of their evil ways; simply speaking, they did not have an appetite for God's Word and as to their

passivity God told them that he would take away even the chance to hear his Word again. The Word says to us: *"They shall wander from sea to sea, And from north to east; They shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the LORD, But shall not find [it]."* (**Amos 8:12**) The worst judgment – God's silence!

These will go from one thing to another, from one church to another, from one seminar to another; they will change visions, pastors, and direction of their life every other week. They will not be stable and steadfast – their plans and life will be in ruin; they will be bound to sundry sins and bad habits, in rebellion against God and His shepherds whom He brings to them, and will not be able to hear God's Word. Or if they do hear it is only what they want to hear, their own ambitions and desires, their own vanity; they will listen only to those who flatter them about their service - people who are headed with them for destruction!

Many people in these last days are seeking everywhere for answers to their problems yet they refuse to find them in God's Word. The only help for them is not to condescendingly pat them on the back, out of fear of hurting them, and say: "It will be alright", rather to direct them to the Bible. Help is in God's Word, and not in man! Not in a change of situations or in a different church!

And the only hope we have is instant obedience to God's Word! That is why I would like to share with you about a man who understood that he and his people were in trouble because they were not obedient to God's Word, and that man is King Josiah.

Word tells us in **2 Kings 22:2** that *"he did what was right in the sight of the Lord..."* When he repaired the temple, which was in ruins and under God's judgment, and while excavating the ruins God's Word was found. In the **8th verse** we read: *"And Hilkiah the high priest said unto Shaphan the scribe, I have found the book of the law in the house of the LORD. And Hilkiah gave the book to Shaphan, and he read it."*

When Shaphan began to read God's Word before the king, we can see the reaction of the man who *"... did [that which was] right in the sight of the LORD"* **verses 11-13**. *"And it came to pass, when the king had heard the words of the book of the law, that he rent his clothes. And the king commanded Hilkiah the priest, and Ahikam the son of Shaphan, and Achbor the son of Michaiah, and Shaphan the scribe, and Asahiah a servant of the king's, saying, Go ye, enquire of the LORD for me, and for the people, and for all Judah, concerning the words of this book that is found: for great [is] the wrath of the LORD that is kindled against us,*

because our fathers have not hearkened unto the words of this book, to do according unto all that which is written concerning us."

You see, this is the attitude of every godly man. This needs to our attitude – not to rend our robes in respect to man, rather in respect to the fact that we have violated God's Word! When we hear God's Word and its principles effective for every area of our life, we need to simply humble ourselves, receive it, and do all that God says; not argue and reject that which we have heard and read. If we do that, nothing else remains but to be rebuked by God!

Certainly, hope exists! We can renew our commitment to God and His Word. We can say, "God, maybe I read Your Word but I didn't keep it, I took it lightly, I criticized it, I laughed at it when others expounded on it, I opposed it with my own human, worldly arguments, but tonight I want to be a man of the Word." I want to be *homo unius libri* – A man of one book – as John Wesley once said.

In **2 Kings 23:3** we read that the king renewed his commitment with God: *"And the king stood by a pillar, and made a covenant before the LORD, to walk after the LORD, and to keep his commandments and his testimonies and his statutes with all [their] heart and all [their] soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. And all the people stood to the covenant."*

Some will say that this is impossible, that this is the Old Testament but if we wish to be like Jesus

we must follow that which He did and said, we must follow the Old Testament as well. We know that every part of the Word is useful! Dietrich Bonhoeffer once said: *“Christianity without the living Christ is inevitably Christianity without discipleship, and Christianity without discipleship is always Christianity without Christ. It remains an abstract idea, a myth.”*

Josiah, although he was king, humbled himself before God without argument because he knew that God would exalt His Word above all! Jesus Christ, although He was God’s Son, fulfilled all that was written about Him, He was obedient to God’s Word to the cost of His disciples and His life. If nothing else matters to you today, I trust that you love Jesus who saved you, therefore read His Word as we finish:

“But Jesus answered and said to him, “Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness.” Then he allowed Him.”
(Matthew 3:15)

“But He answered and said, ‘It is written, ‘Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.’”
(Matthew 4:4)

“Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.”
(Mark 13:31)

“But He answered and said to them, ‘My mother and My brothers are these who hear the word of God and do it.’”
(Luke 8:21)

“For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words, of him the Son of Man will be ashamed when He

comes in His own glory, and in His Father’s, and of the holy angels.”
(Luke 9:26)

“But He said, ‘More than that, blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!’”
(Luke 11:28)

“Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.”
(John 5:24)

“He who is of God hears God’s words; therefore you do not hear, because you are not of God.”
(John 8:47)

“I know that you are Abraham’s descendants, but you seek to kill Me, because My word has no place in you.”
(John 8:37)

“He who rejects Me, and does not receive My words, has that which judges him—the word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day.”
(John 12:48)

"Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him." (John 14:23)

"He who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word which you hear is not Mine but the Father's who sent Me. (John 14:24)

"If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. (John 15:7)

"I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world." (John 17:14)

"Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. (John 17:17)

"I know your works. See, I have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it; for you have a

little strength, have kept My word, and have not denied My name." (Revelation 3:8)

"For I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: If anyone adds to these things, God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book; and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part from the Book of Life, from the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book. He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming quickly." Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:18-20)

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
